

Report from Tamil Nadu :

“Break the shackles of Imperialism and Feudalism” Call by the Speakers at Book release Meeting of Adagu Vykkapattu India

Comrade Tarimela Nagi Reddy made a statement in the Sessions court, Hyderabad, in reply to the accusations made in the conspiracy case by the Government. This statement was published by the Tarimela Nagi Reddy Memorial Trust in English under the title “India Mortgaged” in 1978. It was also published in Telugu in 1980 under the title “Takattulo Bhatatdesam”. It was again agranslated into Hindi and published under the title “Bharat Ek Bandhak Rashtra”. It is now published in Tamil under the title “Adagu Vaikkappatta India”.

The TNM Trust organised a meeting on the occasion of the release of this book on 7th September 2015 at Chennai. The meeting was held at Selva Mahal, MSR Nagar at 3 pm. It was presided over by Comrade Kovai Eswaran, who translated the book into Tamil. He explained how brilliantly Com. TN exposed the treachery committed by the Indian big bourgeoisie by compromising with the imperialism and feudalism. As result, the foreign capital came to occupy the commanding heights in the Indian economy and India was made to seve the interests of imperialism rather than those of Indian people. He also told about the way he overcame the difficulties in translating the book.

Com. P.Jaswantha Rao, Secretary of TNM Trust, released the book and the first copy was received by Com. Madhav Katta. Speaking on the occasion, Com. P.J.Rao said that Com.TN defended Marxism-Leninism and brilliantly substantiated that India remained as a semi-colonial and semi-feudal society. He refuted the charge of treason by saying that it is the Indian ruling classes that betrayed the people and the country and the communist revolutionaries have every right to change this society with revolution. He explained the activities of the TNM Trust and appealed for help for co-operation to extend its activities to Tamil Nadu.

Com Madhav Katta said that the book by Com.TN has given him clarity on the nature of Indian society and of the Indian ruling classes. Prof. Siva Kumar, quoting from the book and giving the present day examples, explained how the Indian economy and industrial sector came to be dominated by the foreign capital.

Com Sangara Subbu, High Court lawyer, said that he had a great respect for Com.TN and it now doubled after reading the book. Com. Baradhi Nathan said that com.TN succinctly explained the need for a new democratic revolution in India that puts an end to imperialist domination and smashes feudalism in India.

Com. G.Vijaya Kumar, president, AITU(New), explained in detail the prevailing situation in the world in which the US imperialism is plunging the world people into bloody wars to establish its hegemony. He also explained the situation prevailing in India, particularly emphasising on the working class movement. Unless and until the working class in India comes out of its slumber and organise class struggle with revolutionary perspective, he concluded, it could not discharge its historic duty of leading the Indian revolution.

Com. Harsh Thakur, democratic rights activist from Bombay, remembered how com. TN formulated the directions to work among the students as well as mass organisations and it resulted in building the student movement in Bombay. Com. Vindhai Vendhan of CPI(ML) Tamil Nadu, said that the revisionism as well as right and left opportunisms have played havoc with the revolutionary movement. Com. TN emphasised on the mass line, in which the people play the crucial and main role, is the primary condition of the successful conclusion of the new democratic revolution in India.

The meeting was well attended by a cross section consisting of workers, peasants, intellectuals, lawyers and students. Many copies of the book published by the TNM Trust were received with enthusiasm and many people expressed the need to take up publications in Tamil.
