In the Midst Of Covid Havoc, Red Flags Hoisted at Many Places in AP and Telangana

In spite of the crisis created by corona, the historic International Day of working class, May Day was observed at several places in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana states. Several local trade unions and mass organizations observed the Mayday by conducting several meetings and by hoisting red flags.

In Anantapur, red flag was hoisted by Com. C. Peddanna (State President AIFTU, (NEW) at Com. TN Bhavan, and at many other places in Anantapur Town.
