

Expose the Political Parties Subservient to Imperialism and Feudalism

Call to State Conference of Hul Jharkhand Kranti Dal (AIKMKS)

The two-day state conference of Hul Jharkhand Kranti Dal (HJKD) affiliated to AIKMKS was held on 27th and 28th September in Dumka district of Jharkhand. Delegates from eight districts of Jharkhand attended the conference. At the beginning of the conference, tributes were paid on the death of Jharkhand State General Secretary of HJKD, Comrade Babudhan Murmu and two other comrades of the National Executive Committee of AIFTU (N), Panchdev Narayan and Kamal Kishore Yadav. Also tributes were paid to all the martyrs of historic struggles against imperialism and feudalism and social change. Two minutes of silence was observed.

The inaugural session of the conference started at auditorium named after Com. Babudhan Murmu. Com Thakuran Soren, an old comrade of Santhal Pargana and life partner of Com Babudhan Murmu welcomed the delegates and farmers present at the conference and said that HJKD organization is spreading today through its struggles all across Jharkhand and especially in Santhal Pargana. She further said, the responsibility of protecting and ideologically strengthening the organisation rests on the shoulders of all our comrades. Today, Com Babu Dhan Murmu is no more, so the responsibility on us is even greater.

The conference started with revolutionary songs and slogans. Comrade Birsa Hembram, presided over the conference. The chief guest of the conference, Jharkhand State President of AIFTU (N), Com Siyasharan Sharma, gave a call to the comrades at the inaugural session and said, human beings by nature have been fighting against exploitation and oppression. But the problems are not resolving because much importance is not given to political struggle. Economic struggle improves our situation and some improvement is also taking place, but due to capitalist politics, our difficulties keep growing due to continuously increasing inflation, taxes, displacement, privatization and anti-people actions of bureaucracy. Therefore, we now have to combine our struggle for equality, collectivism and inclusiveness-based governance to our cultural and social heritage.

The delegates meeting was inaugurated by Comrade Shambhu Mahato, founder member of Hul Jharkhand Kranti Dal and member of the Central Executive Committee of All India Khet Mazdoor Kisan Sabha. He said that since independence the ruling class of our country has been continuing as a comprador to the developed nations (imperialist countries). Today imperialism plunders the entire world through the World Trade Organization, the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund. Today all the national and regional political parties of the ruling class in India stand with these liberalization, globalisation and new economic policies. The policy of selling off the country's resources is abolishing the welfare schemes. Electricity, water, education, hospital, railway, aerodrome, ports, everything from mineral wealth to public sector industries is being sold to domestic and foreign companies. The entire hall echoed with slogans against imperialism and multinational companies.

In the conference, the present situation of Jharkhand and activities report and the constitution of the Hul Jharkhand Kranti Dal were placed before the delegates for discussion by the Presidium which was later passed unanimously.

On the second day of the conference, the President of the State Committee proposed the panel. This conference unanimously elected state committee of HJKD. On behalf of the steering committee of the delegate meeting, Comrades Jasuwa Kachhap, Subhash Murmu, Bhardul Ram, Carnelius Soren and Shankar Nayak in their speeches threw light on the documents of Hul Jharkhand Kranti Dal. Many comrades who attended the delegate meeting gave their speeches in Santali language. So, on the request of the President, Comrade Subhash Murmu presented its Hindi translation in the delegates meeting.

The conference passed the following resolutions – Repeal the Forest Conservation Amendment Act 2023; Stop the ongoing communal violence in Manipur and dismiss the government of Manipur; Proposal to take strict action against the deliberate urinating on a tribal youth by follower of BJP MLA in Madhya Pradesh; against Communalization of constitutional institutions ED, CBI, NIA and various courts and corruption in politics; cancellation of land bank; against air strikes by police in tribal villages of Madhya Pradesh; on the question of giving land to landless and poor farmers; immediately ban mining in the 5th and 6th Schedule area; on the question of giving full rights to Gram Sabha under PESA Act; regarding the return of snatched lands as per CNT, SPT Act; against privatization of education and health; against privatization of roads, electricity and water and others.

Finally, the newly elected President Comrade Birsa Hembram and General Secretary Carnelius Soren addressed the conference. The conference concluded with revolutionary songs and dance with delegates raising slogans with enthusiasm.
